As I write this, the freshet has not yet fully begun. The Minister of Natural Resources (MNRF) John Yakabuski, issued a one-time Ministerial Order to lower the water levels in Round Lake below the licensed Lower Limit by 20 cm, in order to provide more capacity in the Round Lake reservoir.

The spring melt was very slow this year so at time of writing we are not sure of the impact of this measure. It is a good first step in better controlling our waterway and flood zones. I would like to give a shout out to Minister Yakabuski, all of the stakeholders and the three townships for their dedication to this important cause.

Our Lake Steward, Glenn Bingham is involved and knowledgeable on this matter and works on this initiative all winter. My task is to liaise with the local municipalities and the press during the winter and spring.

As usual we have a full slate of activities planned for this summer. These events

CLIMATE CHANGE

GLENN BINGHAM

In August 2017 I attended a seminar in Huntsville which was jointly hosted by the MNRF and the Ontario Centre for Climate Change Impacts and Adaptive Resources (OCCIAR). With the flood of 2017 still fresh in mind I listened to Canada's world-renowned Climatologist Heather Auld, who described how we got to the present condition known as "Climate Change." Heather noted that in the past governments took the NATO approach (No Action Talk Only) to science that was being presented.

I found it ironic that the day preceding the seminar, Huntsville was hit with three tornadoes. It appears that now we are all a little more aware of our changing weather patterns and that the science is being taken more seriously.

Some information and statistics to consider from the Union of Concerned Scientists, who work to ensure that the best independent science informs and motivates public policy:

- Since 2013 the amount of carbon monoxide in our atmosphere has exceeded 400 parts per million, the highest humankind has ever experienced.

- 2017 was the third warmest year in history and the 41st consecutive year with global temperatures registering above the 20th century average.
- The six warmest years of recorded history have all occurred since 2010.


We can expect more extreme weather conditions in various forms such as floods, drought, forest fires, rainfall, wind, etc. to continue. We must realize how our actions are impacting the natural balances and find a means of working and living within those balances. We must learn to adapt to climate change if we are to survive.

FISH COMMITTEE

Our Fish Committee members would like to welcome back all of our seasonal dwellers that have returned to their recreational retreats. Despite the abundance of snowfall this past winter we are pleased to announce that those that had the opportunity to engage in the activity of ice fishing were pleasantly surprised to enjoy a relatively successful catch rate. Some of our well seasoned (pun intended) veterans of the sport have reported having the best year on the frozen tundra in recent memory.

Your dedicated members of the Fish Committee remain focused on making every effort to improve not only the possibility of landing the "big one" but also in efforts to restore the biodiversity in our lake. We are all fully aware that there are many factors affecting the prey to predator ratio and we will continue to prioritize avenues to address the stresses to biodiversity. We continue to work very closely with our Pembroke MNRF contacts, as their expertise gives support and direction to our efforts and is an invaluable resource that we depend and rely upon.

We have taken the stand to promote the practice of catch and release, especially that of our Walleye population. We are pleased that the message is getting out,

and that more of our anglers are fishing responsibly and engaging in this practice that promotes the natural sustainability of this wonderful game fish. There are those that may argue the case that catch and release just may have a high mortality rate. Our response is if you do not practice catch and release the mortality rate is 100% and there isn't any possibility of growth or reproduction.



WATER LEVELS

It may come as a surprise to our membership that water level monitoring is performed year round. The Water Level Committee has already been in communication with various stakeholders and levels of government to ensure that we are collectively prepared to deal with the 2019 freshet. In 2018 Don Bishop, a long time GLPOA member, expressed interest in becoming more active within our association and was appointed to the position as the Chair of Water Levels Committee by your Executive Committee members.

Don is a perfect fit for this position as he can draw from the knowledge and experiences acquired through his many roles in Bishop Water Technologies. As an added bonus Don has resided for thirty-four years on the north shore of Golden Lake and literally has a birds eye view of the Lake (poor guy can't even call in sick). We can almost state that Don has hit the water running and has expressed to RPG our expectations of water level management practices so that year round we can enjoy all that our lake has to offer.

Many thanks to Don for stepping up for this position. Welcome to the team, Don!

WATER QUALITY

Dependent upon favourable weather conditions, all reasonable attempts are made to take samples in an effort to monitor conditions, to determine trends and take actions if unacceptable results are obtained. This coming year water quality monitoring will increase with three new members participating in two separate regimes. Max Hammer will now perform sampling practices through the MNRF Lake Partner Program. Tammy Joudrey and Andy Trafford will now literally come on board and participate with our traditional sampling practices with analysis being performed by Caduceon Labs out of Ottawa. Our Lake has always been well within acceptable standards and with confidence we expect to enjoy a healthy lake for many years to come.

We have responded to issues such as suspected blue/green algae blooms but within short notice samples were taken and sent to the MOECC for analysis. Results indicated the samples taken were not cyano bacteria (blue/green algae) and in fact there has never been a confirmed blue/green algae bloom in Golden Lake.



SMELT HARVEST

If the ice fishing successes are any indication of a turn around, we hope to have an equally successful smelt harvest. Once again we are pleased to announce our fourth annual Smelt Fry will be taking place at the ever popular Sands with food preparation by the staff of The Cottage Cup. We cannot thank our valued sponsors enough. The event will be held on Saturday June 15 and we will pray for good weather and of course your much needed support. We have made plans to make the event even more enjoyable with additional door prizes, and for entertainment you will hear the very talented local artist Richard Martel. *Further details of the event will be provided as the date approaches.*

SHOAL AND CHANNEL MARKING

Safety on our Lake is of paramount importance to the Golden Lake Property Owners Association. Our Hazard marking program provides the essentials to help keep boaters and water enthusiasts safe while having fun on our lake. Last year only a few incidents involving water hazards were reported. This is a great accomplishment considering the increase in boating activity our lake and river has seen over the past few years.

Currently, there are over 50 marker buoys, which are distributed around Golden Lake and the Bonnechere River to warn boaters of water hazards, channels and rocky shoals. Our high-quality marine buoys are manufactured as a single piece of extra strength, flexible vinyl with a reinforced rope-hold. These buoys are tough, durable and expensive. Strong winds and large wakes from boats may cause the buoy to break free. We encourage all boaters and property owners to retrieve any buoys that have broken loose from their anchors and inform the Association where we can pick them up.

The Golden Lake Map has recently been revised with the locations of many known water hazards. Golden Lake Property Owners Association takes great pride in marking as many potential hazards as possible; however, does not guarantee or ensure the accuracy of each and every hazard location. Great care, safe boating practices and good judgement should always be used in navigating Golden Lake and the Bonnechere River. The Government of Canada has a free download on the Marine Transportation website. The Discover Boating app downloads to your smartphone and gives you information about the key rules, guidelines and best practices that will help you and your family stay safe on water. Have a safe summer on our beautiful Lake!
