Smelt Harvest 2018

Through very challenging conditions due to the extreme high water conditions of spring 2017, the resilient and dedicated members of the Fish Committee were able to provide us with enough rainbow smelt to support our second annual Smelt Fry.

The intent of the harvest is to reduce these predators in an effort to improve the lake's biodiversity and balance the preyto-predator ratio. We encourage others to participate and appreciate the results of their efforts. Rainbow smelt is not only tasty, it also offer many health benefits. You can expect the smelt to start spawning in mid-April. It's a short run so please be prepared and harvest safely.

For those who wish to harvest, the process is simple. Golden Lake has numerous streams that flow into the lake. The rainbow smelt spawn along the shores of these streams after dark, usually starting around 10 pm. You must hold a valid fishing license to harvest legally.

Please note that the Bonnechere River is restricted to smelt harvesting only during the spawn.

Smelt nets can be purchased locally and they resemble a long handled landing net with fine mesh. Drag the net along the stream shore, close to the bottom, against the current. Dress appropriately with warm waterproof gloves and boots. Take a pail with a lid.
