

Smelt Harvest 2024

This year harvesters faced a new challenge ... historical low water levels. Leading up to the run there was a fair amount of anxiety as to what or if anything would happen. Especially given the committee needs 1500 smelt in order to host the "Fish Fry". Wet weather & cooler temperatures moved in as the tributary temps came into the trigger 4c - 7c range. The first recorded harvest was on April 6th and peaked within a couple of days. By April 15th the run was basically over. This was the shortest harvest our group has seen since we started taking note of the over abundance in 2016.

Once again there were harvesters from all over the map, some as far as Peterborough & Kingston. It was interesting to hear how some were nostalgic having done this as children and wanting to try again with children

of their own. The Golden Lake harvest has taken on a life of its own as initially the majority focused on getting as many out of the lake as possible. Now all harvesters are partaking for sustenance and the experience.

The "documented" total for 2024 was 195,640. Our belief is this is an ultra conservative number as there are many tributaries and times when we had no observer out taking count's. Since 2016 the documented total is over 1 million!!!

I would be remiss if I did not mention a thank you to Dale Benoit Zohr who invited some harvesters onto the First Nation Pikwakanagan property bordering Cochrane Creek, which over the years has been the most productive.

Treasurer's Report

The Financial summary for the 12 month period ending December 31 2023 shows a starting Balance on January 1 2024 of \$21412.58, revenue of \$35,235.40, disbursements of \$37,307.08, and a balance on December 31 2023 of \$19,340.90. All records are given to an outside accountant for review and report will be given at the Annual General Meeting in July.

Lake Steward Report Spring 2024 Don Bishop

Well, we have survived another winter, which while it may have seemed long for some seemed to go by very quickly. Behind the scenes since the fall there have been a core group of volunteers putting much effort into numerous items for our enjoyment of Golden Lake.

Water Levels - Shawn Cameron of Renfrew Power Generation once again did an outstanding job of managing within the Bonnechere River Water Management Plan and the amendments made to suit our needs. The winter of 2023 2024 had very little snowfall as compared to other years not only here but also in the highlands of Algonquin Park, this combined with little precipitation in March as well as higher temperatures created an early spring. At the end of March, the water levels did not come up much. Logs were add at the end of March early April, from k0 to 18 logs which brought the levels up gradually however this April we had well above normal precipitation which caused RPG to remove all but 8 logs to balance the system.

Buoy markers – With the ice off early this year Mark Hammer who coordinates our shoal marker program is going to see if he and his team can get the buoys in earlier but as volunteers, they are still committed to having them in before the long weekend in May. **Water Testing** - We continue to gather data and report to FOCA Lake Partner Program as scheduled, Secchi Disk readings as well as Total Phosphorous, Chloride and Calcium levels are part of this.

Fish Committee- At the end of Feb Peter and I attended an international conference on walleye rehabilitation in Toronto which allowed us to meet many of the people we have been in contact with and also to witness firsthand what we already knew was that we are on the right track with the correct methodologies and solutions. Our contact list and document gathering continues with more than 1400 scientific papers and supporting documents now in our possession. In mid May, Peter, Jay and I will be heading to Manitoulin Island to visit the Blue Jay Creek Hatchery, the second of only two hatcheries in Ontario that culture walleye, we will visit a commercial fish farm, then to a Fish and Gun Club just north of Sudbury that has run a successful nursey program. On our way back to Golden Lake we will stop at a group from Magnetawan that has their own mobile hatchery.

We still have hopes of getting fish in the water this year however with each passing day that gets a bit more remote which is disappointing, but we have learned so much more in this past year. One of the more interesting observations is that we are not the only group that is having a bureaucracy issue, and also how many people that are keen to create the solution in many parts of Ontario, we are not alone.

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
